

Manchester Circuit Mission Plan 2023: Seeking, serving, sharing Christ

What is the circuit for? One answer to that question is found in our 'book of guidance', CPD: The Circuit is the primary unit in which Local Churches express and experience their interconnexion in the Body of Christ, for purposes of mission, mutual encouragement and help

How is the Manchester Circuit to fulfil this role in the coming years, in our diverse urban environments? Following a period of consultation, we recognise the Spirit working amongst us in many ways, as we share the common purpose of seeking, serving and sharing Jesus Christ in the multiple contexts of the city, through attentive prayerfulness and service.

The Manchester Circuit affirms the four priorities for the Methodist Church as a means of sharing the good news of Jesus and growing disciples:

Worship: we long for Spirit-filled worship which enables worshippers to recognise and acknowledge God's presence and to know God's purpose for them as part of the wider community, inside and outside church

Service: we seek to follow Jesus in seeking justice, standing alongside the many disadvantaged people of this city in loving service, and challenging more privileged people to join with us in this

Learning and Caring: we aim to use our resources effectively to equip people to grow in discipleship

Evangelism: we look for engaging, context-appropriate ways to share the Good News of Jesus Christ and to invite people to join us in following him.

We also acknowledge our role in supporting one another to achieve good governance in the circuit and its churches.

We pray that God will use us as channels for the gifts and graces of the Holy Spirit, especially those which are the distinctive characteristics of the Methodist people: holiness, a passion to overcome injustice and to build genuinely inclusive communities.

What steps can we take as a circuit to put this into practice?

A. Worship

Acts of Worship	To arrange acts of worship for the whole circuit as the situation
	requires.
Resourcing Worship	To identify and train new local preachers and worship leaders reflecting the diversity of the circuit, and to arrange opportunities for existing preachers and worship leaders to engage in theological reflection and learning.
	To liaise with the Learning Network to offer opportunities for churches to discover alternative ways of worshipping.
New Places for New People	We will engage with the Caleb Initiative with the intention to set up new worshipping communities — either face to face or virtual. This will initially be connected to the work at Trinity but other churches are welcome to join in.



B. Service

Social Justice	To affirm the experience of people linked to the circuit who live with
	injustice, including but not limited to racial, gender, LGBTQ+ and
	disability injustice, and to create opportunities for local churches to
	hear and learn from this experience.
	To promote the Connexional 'Justice, Dignity and Solidarity' initiative
	and provide suitable training.
	To encourage local churches to think creatively about how to
	respond to their context missionally and practically.
	To offer whatever support we can to local church initiatives which
	are inclusive and build more just communities.
	To enable local justice practitioners to collaborate and share ideas.
Climate Justice	To take part as appropriate in wider actions and events addressing
	climate justice.
	To support local churches in reducing their carbon footprint.
	To challenge all those associated with the circuit to consider their
	personal carbon footprint.
Outreach	To support, publicise and regularly review existing circuit projects:
	Befrienders, Nexus and the Ancoats Renewal Centre (Trinity). To be
	alert to the potential for new circuit projects.

C. Learning & Caring

Discipleship	To create circuit-wide opportunities for people to reflect together on
	their discipleship, using resources such as the Methodist Way of Life
	to deepen our discipleship.
Generous Living	To challenge churches and their members to generous discipleship
	and build an ethos of giving to support the churches' work.
Pastoral Care and	To provide training to support the circuit's pastoral leaders in
Mission	fulfilling their roles missionally.

D. Evangelism

Children and Families Work	To support those churches who wish to undertake work with children and families by developing a community of practice across the circuit under the leadership of a lay or ordained member of staff. To arrange circuit-wide events for children and families, and to encourage their attendance at Connexional events such as 3Generate.
Missional Outreach	Building on the success of the various 20:20 initiatives supported by the circuit in 2023, strongly to encourage churches to undertake at least one activity annually, designed to invite their local community to engage with the good news of God's love.
God for All	To be intentional about engaging with the Connexional God for All resources, both through circuit activity (eg. the Methodist Way of Life materials and Bible Month) and through ensuring local churches are aware of the available resources.



University Work	To engage with and support whatever programmes are currently being run ecumenically to resource missional work to the universities within the circuit's footprint.
Digital Evangelism	To make effective use of the circuit's website and social media platforms as a way to share the good news of God's love with a wide audience.

E. Governance

Trusteeship	To ensure that the circuit council and the circuit meeting reflect the
Trusteesiiip	diversity of the circuit and are aware of their responsibilities as
	managing trustees.
	To maintain good links and communication between the circuit
	council and local churches through the appointment of circuit
	stewards to each church.
Finance	To ensure that the finances of the circuit are effectively managed,
	with due attention to funding for local mission activity and an
	effective grants policy.
	To remind all members of their responsibility to take part in
	supporting the activities of the circuit as they are able, and to
	conduct periodic stewardship campaigns.
Property	To maintain the circuit's property to a good standard, and to
	implement a flexible programme of sales and purchases to release
	funds for local mission and provide premises that fit the circuit's
	needs and are eco-friendly.
	To offer support to local churches where necessary through the
	advice of the property group.
Safeguarding	To maintain the appointment of a suitably qualified circuit
	safeguarding officer and offer them appropriate support in ensuring
	that good-quality training is regularly available
	To do our best to model good safeguarding practice across the
	circuit.
Employees and	To ensure that all circuit employees are recruited and line managed
volunteers	in line with current legislation and Connexional and District
	guidance.
	To retain the services of an external HR provider to resource this.
	To ensure that all volunteers are recruited safely and appropriately
	supported in their roles, in line with current Connexional and District
	guidance.
	To provide the resources that circuit staff and volunteers need to
	make them as effective as possible.
Communication	To share information about the work of the circuit as widely as
Communication	possible.
	To alert local churches to relevant developments in the wider
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	community.
	To maintain the appointment of a community engagement officer to
	undertake this.

To be reviewed for the circuit council of July 2023 and the circuit meeting of September 2023 and then annually thereafter.
